TRUSTEES

The work continues on the parking lot. A French drain was installed the length of the parking lot and along the north side. This will allow the underground water to drain away from the parking lot and prolong the life of the asphalt. New lighting for the lot will be placed in the near future.

We are still planning to replace the heating and cooling unit in the fellowship hall as soon as funding for that project is secured. We are also continuing to put together bids for the possible renovation of the front lobby and front bathrooms.

The Trustees have also been made aware of a gift of \$7000 that was left to Greenbrier FUMC from the estate of Freda Lou Wilson Mobley. It was designated to be placed in the building fund and a portion will be used to cover the expenses of the parking lot and placement of the French drain. That money should be distributed to the church this summer. We are thankful for this family remembering our church in their will.

FOOD PANTRY NEWS

The delay in getting the parking lot paved has slowed down the pantry usage a bit. However we expect the lot to be paved soon and the usage to increase. We still have needs of 1 lb hamburger meat rolls, hamburger and tuna helpers, cereals, hot dogs, juice and peanut butter. We are thankful for Centerville UMC that brought us boxes of food last week.

Thanks to all who filled up their M&M tubes with quarters for our special Mother's day M&M offering. You raised over \$1000 dollars for our food bank which will go a long way this summer to helping to feed families in Faulkner County.

So far we have helped 143 families and are on our way to feeding over 300 families for the 4th year in a row. Your support of this outreach program helps give people enough food to get them through a week and is a valuable witness for Christ. This summer, Arkansas children, for whom school lunch and breakfast may be the only meals they can depend on, are at even more risk. Lets make sure we do our part to help our Arkansas kids this summer.!

Shepherds (Hopefully youth can do this with a few adults here and there)


Someone to run music, videos, etc.
